

The New Roman Missal- The Holy Holy- Sanctus

Now back to the Mass translation changes, little by little. We move to the "Holy, Holy" or also called the "Sanctus". This is an ancient prayer of our church and comes right out of the Scriptures. The first line comes from Isaiah 6:1-3 and the final lines come from Matthew's Gospel, 21:9. The newer translation goes better with the scripture. The word "hosts" refers to all the multitudes gathered in heaven, the angels and all. They are all there at the command of God.

Present Translation

Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might.

New Translation

Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of hosts.

Another simple change is after the Body and Blood of Christ have been elevated. The priest presently says, "Let us proclaim the mystery of faith." He will say only, "The mystery of faith." This calls for a response. Kind of like when the priest says, "The gospel of the Lord." It is after the proclamation of the gospel that he states this fact and then you all respond with, "Praise to you Lord Jesus Christ." Now after the bread and wine are the body and blood of Jesus, the priest states the fact that is "The mystery of faith" and you respond with one of three affirmations (found on your pew cards).

You will notice a change in the Eucharistic prayer said by the priests. Again, you will see a bit more of the poetic language used, like the following line: "Make holy, therefore, these gifts, we pray, by sending down your Spirit upon them like the dewfall." There are some other significant changes in the words of institution, i.e. the words the priest says that quotes Jesus at the last supper, and they might raise some eyebrows, but I will get to those next week. Anticipation is a good thing.
