

The New Roman Missal- The Creed (cont.)

So, let's look at this word, "consubstantial" in the new translation of the creed. The hardest part might just be pronouncing it (con sub stan chel). It is a mouthful. The present line is, "one in Being with the Father." These words describe the relationship between Jesus and the Father, and are probably closer to the original Greek. The Latin uses the word, *consubstantialis*, which means having the same substance, articulates better the orthodox faith of the early church, expressing more clearly the dogma of Jesus' divinity. Being that we don't use this word for anything else, and there's nothing else like the relationship between the Father and the Son, we use a distinct word for a distinct relationship.

Now that we have gone over the word "consubstantial," let's move on with the creed. Putting it side by side, we can make some comparisons.

Present Text

For us men and for our salvation
he came down from heaven:
by the power of the Holy Spirit
he was born of the Virgin Mary,
and became man.
For our sake he was crucified under
Pontius Pilate;
he suffered, died, and was buried.
On the third day he rose again
in fulfillment of the Scriptures;

New Translation of Text

For us men and for our salvation
he came down from heaven,
and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate
of the Virgin Mary,
and became man.
For our sake he was crucified under
Pontius Pilate,
he suffered death and was buried,
and rose again on the third day
in accordance with the Scriptures.

So we see another big word "incarnate," which means literally "given flesh." It professes our belief that the Word became flesh **in** the womb of the Virgin Mary. The word "born" could be understood that Jesus became flesh **when** Jesus was born, which is not our faith. Jesus was not just born by the power of the Holy Spirit, but was conceived that way. The next change does not seem to roll off the lips too well, "suffered death." The Latin literally says that "he suffered and was buried," and in Latin the word suffered implies dying. But that doesn't quite complete the thought for us in English, so the translators chose *suffered death* to express what really happened and that Jesus really died. Lastly, we see the change to the word **accordance** as opposed to **fulfillment**. It might not seem like too much of a difference and truly both words are good, but accordance means more of *according to* and brings more clarity of how all that Jesus had done was in line with the scriptures.

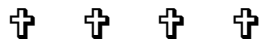
